After seven years under a Federal Reserve-imposed growth cap for its past scandals, **Wells Fargo** just got its **growth privileges** back.


Dollar General rang up a 5% sales boost – foot traffic dipped, but the shoppers who did show up spent more. **Discount digs** are the new luxe.
