| 422 | Douglas | 5/16/17 | Charter amendment exempting partial terms from being included in determining when two consecutive four-year terms have been served for Members of the Council. | Pass | 50.6% |
| 423 | Douglas | 5/16/17 | Charter amendment recognizing appointment designation of an official. | Fail | 48.8% |
| 424 | Douglas | 5/16/17 | Charter amendment requiring Council action within 10 days for ratification of a proclamation issued by the Mayor. | Pass | 52.8% |
