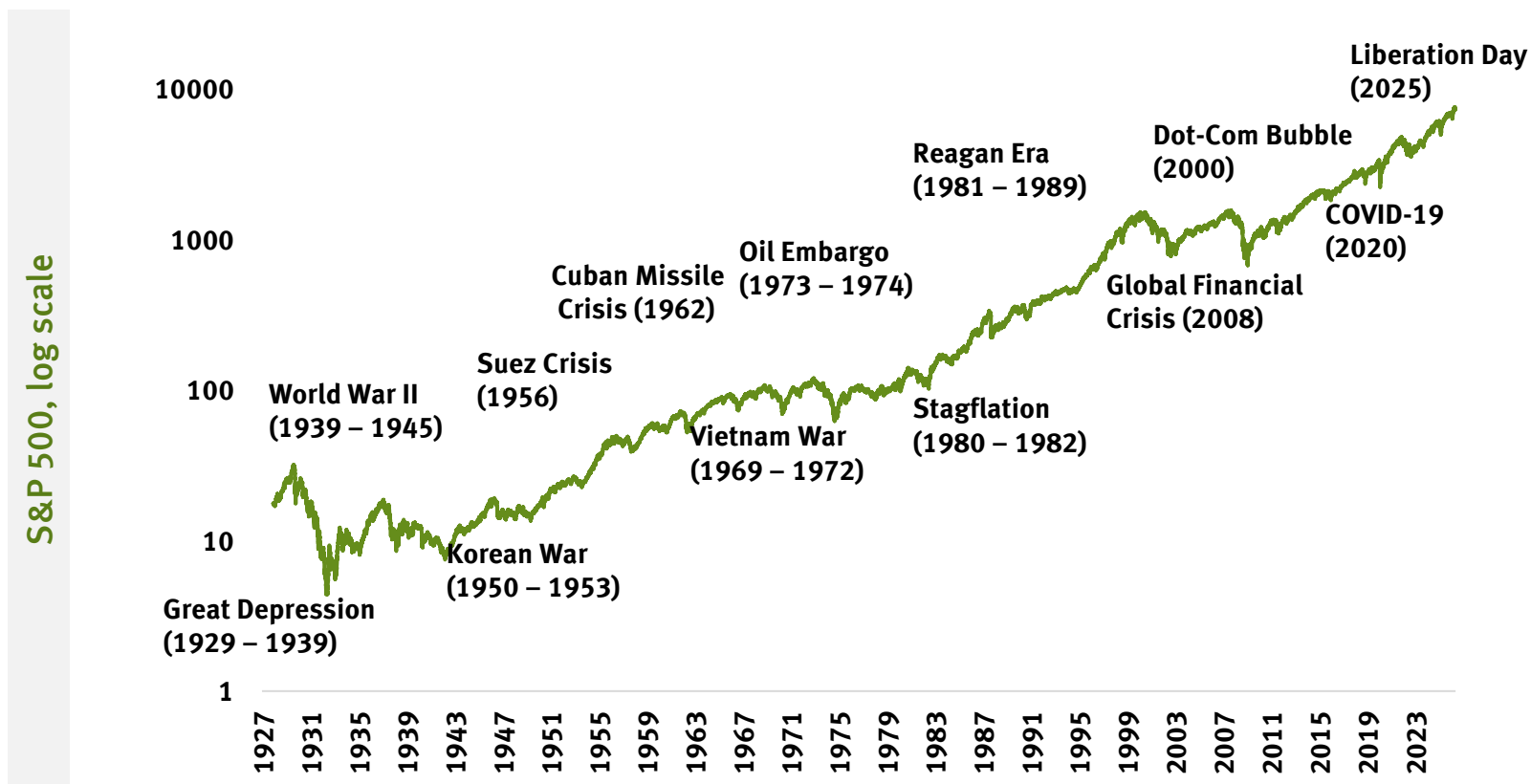


Almost 100 years of S&P 500 history
