NATO, the 32-country, "you mess with one of us, you mess with all of us" alliance, is back in the spotlight. Last week, members agreed to raise their defense spending goals, with a new push toward spending **5% of GDP**, up from the long-standing 2% target.

Why the change? Rising **global tensions**, Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and China's growing assertiveness have made national security a front-burner issue again.
