




What adventure can Budget Bunny and friends have today?





"I will help with a chore to <u>earn</u> money," says Penny. Earning is when you are given money for work or chores. Penny earns \$2.00 for helping with the dishes.



Did Budget Bunny and friends meet their \$10.00 goal to start a lemonade stand? Add up the money for each friend on the line next to the money.














By working together, the friends sell all of the lemonade!






Look at the pictures of the coins on the left and the amounts of money on the right.

Draw a line to match each coin with the correct amounts of money.







"Wow, that is a lot of money,"


says Dusty. "Where can we spend the money we earned?"

Bud and friends ran a successful lemonade stand. Where can they spend the money they earned? Follow the maze to explore St. Louis landmarks.







Tito exclaims, "We should go to the Saint Louis Art Museum in Forest Park!"



Bud asks, "Maybe we can visit the Saint Louis Zoo?"




"I think we should count butterflies in the park! How many do you see, Penny?"




Penny says, "I want to see dinosaurs at the Saint Louis Science Center!"



Tito asks, "What if we take it all to the bank and put it in a <u>savings</u> account?"








There are five differences between these pictures. Can you help Bud find what is missing in the image below? Circle the missing objects.
